SHARING HIS PASSION

ach Sheaffer, a 2022 Upper Sandusky graduate and recipient of the Charles and Jean Gottfreid scholarship, has loved the game of basketball for as long as he can remember. This past summer, Sheaffer shared his passion with other basketball players when he organized the Bicentennial 3 on 3 basketball tournament. Twenty teams in three age categories participated in the tournament. Sheaffer donated the \$1,000 proceeds from the tournament to the Robert P. Lee Memorial Scholarship. Sheaffer said his intention was to do something to give back to the community of Upper Sandusky that provided him with so many opportunities when he was growing up and to pay something forward. Sheaffer said, "I have heard many stories about how much sports and Upper Sandusky meant to Mr. Lee. I wanted to honor his passion and contribute to his scholarship."

Currently, Sheaffer is a senior at The Ohio State University majoring in sports industry and is planning to graduate in May 2026. In addition to his studies, he is a third-year manager for the women's basketball team. "I feel very fortunate that I get to live my



passion for basketball every day," Sheaffer said. "It was a pretty amazing feeling to be on the basketball court when the team won the 2024 Big Ten championship, the championship ring is an extra bonus." Additionally, Sheaffer experienced his basketball passion this past summer when he took a study abroad class in Germany. He was able to attend a professional basketball game in Munich. "The atmosphere was very different from any NBA game I have attended," Sheaffer said, "The fans were on their feet the entire game and the outcome of the game didn't matter to either team. It was a very exciting experience." He also was able to tour the 1936 Olympic stadium in Berlin where Jesse Owens won his five gold medals. "It was pretty special, as an Ohio State fan, to see his name in the stadium."

Sheaffer's ultimate goal is to become a college basketball coach. "It will be a long process to get where I want to be. Right now, I am focusing on gaining experience and developing professional connections." He is thankful for the scholarships he received. "It means a lot to me that someone was willing to invest in my future and believe that I would be successful."

NEW SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

Recently WCCF worked with Upper Sandusky Exempted Village Schools to take ownership of four scholarships that were once managed by the school district. The scholarships and requirements are as follows:

- **KATHRYN ARTZ MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** | The student awarded this scholarship shall have shown musical aptitude in vocal or instrumental music, shall have indicated a desire to study music in college, and shall have participated in organized school musical activities. Student's needs for financial assistance shall be given first consideration.
- **ELIZABETH BARDON SCHOLARSHIP** | Need of financial assistance, desire to pursue higher education in a 4-year program, high moral character, good citizenship qualities, and a record of academic accomplishment are all taken into account in awarding this scholarship.
- ELLEN MATTESON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP | Need of financial assistance, desire to pursue higher education in a 4-year program, high moral character, good citizenship qualities, and a record of academic accomplishment are all taken into account in awarding this scholarship.
- **CB SWEIGARD TRUST SCHOLARSHIP** | For students with a grade point average of 2.5-3.2. Two essays are required and will be carefully reviewed in the selection process. (A special application form and essay topics are available in the Upper Sandusky High School's School Counselor's office.) Proof of enrollment in a post-secondary will be required before a scholarship check is issued.

We are so pleased USEVS has entrusted us with these scholarships. It is a great honor to memorialize the individuals named in each scholarship. WCCF'S GIFTS OF GRAIN PROGRAM LAUNCHES 100 BUSHEL CLUB

Wyandot County Community Foundation (WCCF) is committed to supporting our local agricultural community. After collaborating with a focus group of farmers, we learned about their hopes for the future of agriculture in Wyandot County. WCCF then established our Gifts of Grain program. The funds raised through this program are donor-directed – where our farmer focus



group provides feedback and direction — all to benefit Wyandot County agriculture. This year our farmer focus group has created the 100 Bushel Club as an extension of our Gifts of Grain program. The idea behind this program is to encourage farmers to donate 100 bushels of grain to support future Wyandot County farmers. Grain donations we received last harvest season will pay for several scholarships towards tuition for FFA and 4-H camps within the coming year. The donation process is simple. We have already set up accounts at the local grain elevators. When you deliver your grain, ask the elevator to transfer a number of bushels or a certain percentage to WCCF. We will take care of it from there and will send you a receipt from the transaction, leaving you to take advantage of the tax benefits. It is an uncomplicated way to make a lasting difference.


