

A \$4000 GRANT SUPPORTS LOCAL BLOOD DRIVES.

The American Red Cross of North Central Ohio extends its heartfelt thanks to the WCCF for awarding a generous grant of \$4,000. This support helped us carry out twenty blood drives across Wyandot County from September 1, 2024, to February 1, 2025. Thanks to the community's participation, we successfully collected 992 units of blood from 302 dedicated donors, including 27 first-time donors. Each blood drive involves significant costs, with medical supplies sourced nationally at an average expense of \$5,000 per event. Given the numerous national disasters and unpredictable weather conditions this winter, the ability to hold blood drives in Wyandot County has been incredibly valuable and necessary.

We are also deeply appreciative of our local partners who played a crucial role in hosting these drives, including Wyandot Memorial Hospital, Carey Shrine Cafeteria, Sycamore Community Center, John Stewart Methodist Church, and Upper Sandusky Elks Lodge. Your support makes a tremendous difference in our efforts to save lives.



WYANDOT SENIOR VILLAGE GRANT PROJECT

A Wyandot County Community Foundation grant assisted Wyandot Senior Village staff in creating a quiet reflective garden space for their tenants. A concrete walkway, fountains, a log bench, pineapple urns, barrels and footer pads were purchased using WCCF grant money and funds from other sources.



WHAT ARE ESPORTS? Esports is short for electronic sports – a form of competitive video gaming that is organized into leagues, tournaments and other structured events, similar to traditional sports.
