• BUILDING A COMMITTED BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Gottfried joined the WCCF Board of Directors in 2011. At that time, active board members were John Mizick, Molly Synder and Sara Lou Brown. They were struggling to maintain an engaged group. It was clear; dedicated board members were needed. Gottfried worked with the board to recruit members that represented various locations of the county and were willing to devote time and talents to WCCF. Today eleven enthusiastic members serve on the board and a group of volunteers assist with events, mailings, and more.

• ESTABLISHING AN E-MAIL ADDRESS, WEBSITE, FACEBOOK PAGE AND NEWSLETTER.

• OUTREACH EFFORTS

Sponsoring "College Send-Off" events, Outreach Lunch and Learn programs for nonprofits and helping with the Wyandot County Courthouse Restoration Campaign.

• GROWING THE WYANDOT COMMUNITY FOUNDATION GRANT FUND

Through a 2013 "Plant the Seed Campaign" \$20,000 was raised so WCCF could award grants to local 501(c)3 organizations and governmental units based on their applications. The fund's current balance is \$123,085.00. Since 2013, 109 grants have been awarded.

• ADDING 19 FUNDS ESTABLISHED BY FAMILIES AND ORGANIZATIONS

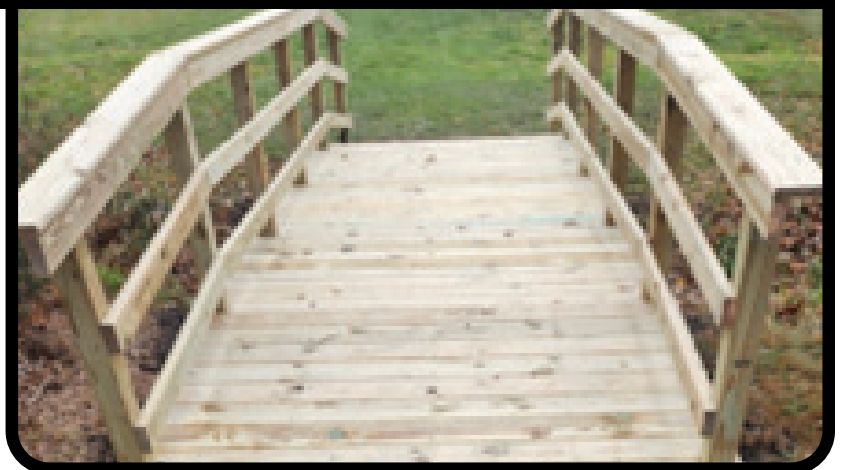
They include 13 scholarships, 3 community need funds, 1 field of interest fund, 1 organization endowment and 1 donor advised growth fund.

• LOOKING TO THE FUTURE THROUGH STRATEGIC PLANNING - 2023

WCCF evaluated its programs and set goals to be accomplished in the future. In recent months, the Board of Directors achieved two of its goals by securing an office facility and hiring Erin Smith as Executive Director.

NEW BRIDGE AT ENTRANCE OF STORY STROLL TRAIL :SWCD GOTTFRIED NATURE CENTER

A WCCF grant paid for 80% of the cost of a new bridge at the Gottfried Nature Center. Donations helped pay the rest. The new wider bridge will accommodate large strollers. This will be helpful for younger families who wish to visit the center from Township Hwy. 111. The Story Stroll Trail will start at the bridge. Excerpts from Evelyn Long's (Grandma Tellmie) Nature Booklets will be posted along the trail. Signs funded by sponsors have been printed and will be installed in the spring. Watch for the Dedication of the Story Stroll Trail in the Spring.

LIFE AFTER THE DASH BY ELLEN SHEAFFER

In recent years, the time between college and what comes next has been referred to as the “dash.” The time that separates being students and becoming alumni, between learning and doing, the now and the future. 2021 Upper Sandusky graduate, Gavin Carey, is currently in the process of navigating the “dash.” Carey is on track to graduate in May with a degree in business administration, specializing in economics, from the Fisher College of Business at The Ohio State University. He recently was a recipient of the Wyandot County Foundation's newest scholarship, the Logsdon Scholarship Fund.

Carey had a good idea of how he saw his future. “I always knew I wanted to be involved in the business world but wasn't quite sure what specialization I wanted to pursue. I finally realized that I was very interested in economics after taking a microeconomics class through Marion Technical College.” He has been able to gain hands on experience through a summer internship with an electrical contracting company, Cupertino Electric Inc. He had the opportunity to visit the company headquarters in San Jose, California to meet other employees and learn the history of the company. Additionally, he had the chance to experience Europe and traveled across France, Spain, and Italy during the summer of 2024. “These experiences helped broaden my horizon and helped me step out of my comfort zone by trying new things,” Carey explained. Finishing college can be a stressful time and figuring out financial matters compounds that stress. Carey appreciates the contribution the Logsdon Family made to the Foundation. “I am very thankful for the Logsdon Scholarship as it has allowed me to focus on my senior year of college without having to worry about making ends meet financially. I am also very thankful for all the previous scholarships that I have received in the past, as I would not be in the position I am in today without them.”



So, what are his plans for after the “dash?” Carey has accepted a position with Cupertino Electric, where he completed his summer internship, at a new job site in Bowling Green, Ohio. He hopes to have a long career with the company and give back to his home community of Upper Sandusky.

- Pizza Co., which works on following directions and giving change
- Monster, which gives students a prompt of what to draw, then animates it in a scene
- Tangrams, which works on problem solving and direction following
- Costume Party, which allows the students to pretend it is Halloween every day!

The kids also really love how they each have their own account, where their progress is saved from day-to-day, so it is no big deal when their turn at Osmo is up!



DOG PARK SIDEWALK INSTALLED WITH GRANT MONEY!
