8 GRANTS TOTALING \$9,700 ASSIST CAREY LIBRARY

At a recent Donor Appreciation Event, Mandy Huston, Dorcus Carey Public Library Assistant Librarian and grant writer, shared how beneficial Wyandot County Community Foundation grants have been to expand the Library's diverse programing. "Since 2014, 8 grants ranging from \$500 to \$2,846 have been awarded." said Huston "Grants have supported children's, teen, and adult programming and have helped to upgrade network equipment to improve Wi-Fi access. Other materials and program purchased through WCCF grants are an entrance sign, kitchen range and cooking tools, STEM programing for science and engineering classes, and learning toys and storage in the Children's play area.

Lillian Orians, An Educational Journey.

harles and Jean Gottfried Scholarship recipient and 2018 Upper Sandusky High School graduate, Lillian Orians, developed an interest in biomedical engineering when a high school friend needed surgery. "My friend was having knee surgery and her doctors were working with biomedical engineers. I thought the field seemed to mesh my loves for math and science with health and medicine," Orians recalls.

Orians earned a Bachelor of Science degree in biomedical engineering from the University of Cincinnati in 2023. One of her favorite experiences in college was being a part of an organization called EnableUC, a volunteer-lead student organization that uses 3D printing and engineering to provide prosthetics and assistive devices to those in need, at no cost to them. She noted, "A favorite project of mine within that organization was designing a pair of body-powered hook prosthetics for a boy in Bolivia who had lost his hands in an accident. My team designed custom prosthetics for him when the club's traditional prosthetics were not meeting his needs. The project had a lot of challenges,

including two language barriers, but was incredibly rewarding. Applying the skills, I was learning in class, to real-world problems was great, and knowing I played a part in improving someone's everyday life was super fulfilling." She completed five internships while earning her degree, which helped her decide on a career path after college. She is currently working as a biomedical engineer for JALEX Medical, in Westlake Ohio, that specializes in medical device development.

She is grateful for the scholarship, "I think scholarships are an amazing thing for students because, not only does it help with the financial burden of college, but also tells students that someone is investing in their future. I always felt that someone willing to award me a scholarship was telling me they believed I would be successful, and I think that can be a huge motivation for a lot of people."

ROLLOVER INTO TAX SAVINGS

Distributions from a Qualified IRA is a great way to give to the foundation. You may give up to \$100,000 from your IRA directly to a qualified charity without having to pay income taxes on the distribution. This is known as the IRA Charitable Rollover.
